### My Writing Process Checklist

- Come up with a really crappy topic and free write it
- Identify the scrap of gold in the crap I wrote above
- Get overly passionate and create a draft that is entirely a rant
- Tone down the rant to be more academic and analytical
- Write a completely new draft
- Scrap most of that draft and begin to flesh out the paper more
- Create at least two new drafts
- Get a peer to review it and change a bunch of stuff I thought was working that wasn't
- Check rubric to make sure I'm hitting everything I should
- Revise again
- Turn in the draft
- Review notes on how it could've been improved
- Continue to think about this and mold your ideas on it for the rest of your life, potentially go back to it and change it or use it again.
